Wrap up of the year and hopes for 2026

2025: Igniting the Future of Innovation

This year, we pursued our mission to take companies a step further in their path to market. We brought clarity when the road ahead was uncertain. And thanks to our team's expertise, the tools we've built, and our commitment to walking the path alongside our clients, we close a year that has been deeply rewarding.

The year in context

Innovation in 2025 proved one thing: progress is no longer linear. It's a network of breakthroughs converging across disciplines, geographies, and markets. The pace of translation is rewriting the rules of possibility.

The world moved beyond emergency responses to build durable infrastructure for innovation. In sustainability and deep tech, hydrogen projects like H2SITE demonstrated how solutions can integrate with logistics, turning vision into viable industry. Industrial biochar projects and circular bioeconomy initiatives like FENIX and BioBoost moved from pilot to field scale, proving that climate positive technologies can deliver measurable impact at speed.

Artificial intelligence continued to reshape biotech: among our clients, Pharmacelera led the way in Insilco drug discovery, while Predictheon drove innovation in predictive anaesthetic and sedation procedures. These advances underscored a critical truth: acceleration succeeds only when paired with rigorous validation. Evidence—whether from clients, payers, investors, or regulators—has become the new currency of adoption.

Creating concrete pathways

At Inveniam Group, we build bridges between public funding and private capital, between research and market access, guiding innovators through complexity with clarity and confidence. Our mission remains unchanged: to create new pathways for ideas that will redefine industries and improve lives.

This was the first year of our Ignite Health program run in partnership with 2blabs and investor partners. Next year a new Ignite Climate program will be launched in parallel with Ignite Health. These programs that embody Inveniam's approach by combing strategic consulting, public funding support and seed investment for early-stage companies facing the critical gap between research and market readiness.

We also expanded our work as an official provider under the EIC Access+ Program, supporting beneficiaries from EIC Transition, Accelerator, Pathfinder, and Seal of Excellence. Through this program, EIC beneficiaries can access co-funded support across fundraising, market strategy and technology transfer.

In 2026, we will continue the work that makes convergence possible, and we look forward to supporting new teams as we narrow the space between discovery and deployment together.

03 Some relevant success cases



We have had a busy year with H2Site. We supported them to win 2 grants this year. The first, an EIC Accelerator blended grant, will support the development of their novel ammonia-cracking technology. Additionally, a grant from the Institute for Energy Diversification and Saving (IDAE), will boost their production capacity and provide the foundation to strengthen the entire manufacturing process.



PYRAH2 has secured Horizon Europe funding to develop a new process that converts biogenic waste into renewable hydrogen and solid carbon. The project offers a scalable, cost-efficient alternative to current hydrogen production methods, supporting Europe's climate goals and creating circular value from waste materials.



Inveniam Group supported DEBIOS in securing a Public-Private Partnership Project to finance the development and clinical validation of a noninvasive test for the diagnosis and monitoring of renal fibrosis in patients with chronic kidney disease. DEBIOS was also selected for the Inveniam IGNITE program.



Inveniam provided FACSA with a Tech Scouting service to identify innovation opportunities across the water sector. The work included mapping the Iberian technology ecosystem, preselecting solutions with high industrial application potential, and building a qualified pipeline of startups and technology providers for proof-of-concept development and future strategic collaborations.



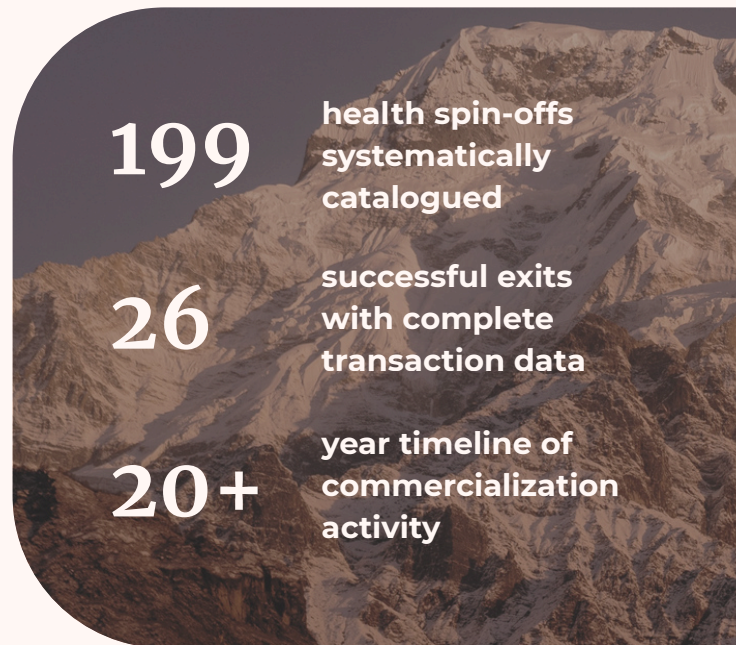

Ignite Accelerator

Inveniam has launched IGNITE, an acceleration program that addresses the funding gap preventing promising health and climate innovations from accessing the expertise and capital they need at critical early stages. Created with 2blabs and an investor partner, IGNITE provides strategic consulting, public funding guidance and up to €250k in seed investment to early-stage companies. It offers tailored support in market access, business modelling, financial planning and intellectual property.

The Health Sector Report

Evolution and Trends of Scientific Entrepreneurship in the Health Sector in Spain, co-created with **Fundación Botín**, is the first systematic analysis of Spain's health technology transfer ecosystem, examining health spin-offs from public research institutions since 2001.
